6. RDA Consulting presentation – RDA Staff

Overview

Anisa Vallejo gave introductions and an overview of the RDA process. Also, with the current concerns in Davis, she said the County has reached out to various entities to provide support. RDA thanked HPAC, County and other partners and gave an overview and update on HHAP 3 plan development. The PIT count showed a general increase in the homeless population but a decrease in those unsheltered. For demographics, American Indian/Alaskan were overrepresented by 800% and Black/African American by 500%. Both groups are underrepresented in Yolo County Housing. They also discussed the surveys and focus groups and highlighted success and potential opportunities. This included increasing beds and services, and the need to address racial inequities and cultural competence concerns.

Goals and Action Plan

- They plan on continuing with the same 4 goals as the 2019 plan: 1) Strengthen the homeless crisis response system 2) Increase permanent housing 3) Improve collaboration 4) Strengthen system level coordination They discussed that the plan is a tool that helps with accountability, funding decisions, supports coordination, establish priorities, aligns with federal and state principles, and discussed example of implementation in different areas
- They discussed the action plan including goals, strategies, and action steps, and the make up of the Action Planning Committee. They described how over 7 months they held a total of 6 meetings that involved tactic brainstorms, tactic refinement, and approving recommendations.

Questions/Discussion

- Commissioner Hull asked about equity issues and West Sacramento projects. RDA replied that inequities do exist and discussed how they are being addressed with different tools such as equity program measures. West Sacramento is included in some of the work.
- Commissioner Lansburgh asked how we are considering different ethnic groups and how overdose prevention and harm reduction is supported. RDA replied that race and identity demographics are collected, and that Crisis

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Now and other programs are addressing harm reduction issues. Anisa Vallejo highlighted the need to engage partners and businesses.

- A question was asked from the public about success and prevention, and RDA gave an example involving eviction prevention and how tactics, stakeholder feedback, and implementation would function to address the issue.
- Commissioner Hull enquired about how often things are reported, who is doing the work, and that there are a lot of moving parts. Response from Anisa Vallejo that things are reported monthly/quarterly, and RDA added that some things will be determined through committee makeup and groups, and that promoting input and communication is crucial.
- A question from the public asked how implementation for transitional housing is going, as they fell through the cracks. RDA responded that we do need to change how we do things and better access to programs, and Anisa Vallejo added that we need to look at what barriers people are facing and how we can address them.
- Another question from the public asked about how the subcommittees are going to work, and that participating members might need some support. Anisa Vallejo responded that they are attaching goals to subcommittees, the County will be taking on some tasks, and that there may be funding available. Commissioner Doug Zeck added that we do need more members and need to be effective with our subcommittees.
- RDA thanked everybody for all their work and input in the process. Lots of community, County, and broad input. Commissioner Douc Zeck thanked RDA, the County, and the staff.
