## Infrastructure Upgrades beginning on Russell Boulevard and County Road 89

**(Woodland, CA)** – The Yolo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, in collaboration with the Yolo County Department of Community Services' Public Works Division, are preparing to replace several decaying culvert pipelines at both Russell Boulevard and County Road (CR) 89 around the City of Winters.

The District's contractors are scheduled to conduct these essential infrastructure upgrades beginning March 18 until March 29, operating Monday through Friday, between 8 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Work will be conducted concurrently at both locations, subject to weather conditions.

Residents are advised to anticipate intermittent lane closures during this process. Traffic control will be managed by the Road Maintenance staff of the Public Works Division at the two work locations:

- Russell Boulevard, approximately half a mile east of Interstate 505, just east of Fredericks Drive
- CR 89, at the intersection of CR 27

Please note that each section of CR 27 approaching the intersection with CR 89 could be closed at times due to this work.

Motorists should expect delays and are encouraged to seek alternate routes. Detours will be arranged to guide motorists around any full road closures. Local access to properties and businesses along these road sections will be maintained during construction.

This collaborative effort will support the region's irrigation service and improve storm drainage capabilities. Motorists are encouraged to exercise caution, adhere to construction signage, and respect the instructions of flaggers when navigating through work zones.
