In addition, a Capital Improvement Plan was approved to address fencing improvements and other security aspects to the campuses	Although the due date for implementation of this recommendation is not until the beginning of the 2024- 25 school year, the Grand Jury is requesting a status report as to what the District has done to date towards the implementation of this recommendation.	<ul> <li>The Security Camera Audit was conducted in the Spring of 2023.</li> <li>Based on the results of the audit, a three-phase implementation was developed.</li> <li>As of March 2024, phase 1 of the implementation has been completed and we are initializing the 2nd phase.</li> <li>The Capital Improvement Plan to address fencing and other security measures on the campuses will begin this summer with 4 school sites undergoing fencing projects.</li> </ul>
R-4 Prior to the start of the 2024- 25 school year, each school district should require and document that training related to threats of violence is completed by its teachers (regular and substitute), staff and administrators every	WJUSD responded: "In collaboration with the Woodland Police Department (WPD) during the 2023-24 school year, all secondary school sites in the District will receive level 2 of Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate (ALICE) training." "Additionally, all elementary school sites and other district staff will have received by the 2023-24 school year, the level 1 training for ALICE."	Although the due date for implementation of this recommendation is not until the beginning of the 2024- 25 school year, the Grand Jury is requesting a status report as to what the District has done to date towards the implementation of this recommendation.	As of April 2024 all but one of our secondary sites has received level 2 of the Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate (ALICE) training. We are scheduled for the final site to be trained before the beginning of the 24-25 school year. For our elementary sites- we are still in the process of training and have 10 of our 12 elementary sites trained in level 1 of ALICE. To be noted - these trainings are on a rotating basis of every three years. The final 2 elementary sites will be trained next year along with the sites that will be due for training updates.
