#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

1. Receive Update on DRAFT 2030 Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (Attachment F).

#### **REASON FOR RECOMMENDED ACTION**

County staff and the Yolo County Climate Action Commission ('Commission') are nearing the completion of the Climate Action and Adaptation Plan ('CAAP') update process and have released the DRAFT 2030 CAAP for Public Comment from June 7th to July 10th, 2024 through the Public Comment Portal.

#### BACKGROUND

On September 29, 2020, the Yolo County Board of Supervisors passed Resolution No. 20-114, titled "A Resolution Declaring a Climate Crisis Requiring Urgent and Inclusive Mobilization in Yolo County." This resolution set forth the ambitious goal of achieving a countywide carbon-negative (climate-positive) footprint by 2030 and urged the investment of countywide resources to initiate a just transition to an inclusive, equitable, sustainable, and resilient local economy while also supporting and advocating for regional, national, and international efforts necessary to reverse the climate, social justice, and economic crises. The resolution directed the County to create a working advisory body, the Yolo County Climate Action Commission ('Commission') to develop and propose a new CAAP, designed to reduce all greenhouse gas emissions in Yolo County and achieve the County's ambitious climate goals. County staff and the Commission are nearing the end of the CAAP update process, having taken the following steps:

- September 2021: Commission begins meeting.
- January 2023: County launches CAAP development process.
- April 2023: County begins hosting public education and outreach events to solicit input on CAAP strategies and priorities.
- **June 2023:** County hosts the first 3 CAAP Community Workshops to solicit input on key climate impacts facing Yolo County community members.

- November 2023 January 2024: County hosts 9 in-person Community Workshops across the County focused on soliciting hyper-local feedback on specific CAAP strategies, measures, and actions, as well as 2 virtual workshops.
- February 26, 2024: Commission approves CAAP Emission Reduction and Adaptation Strategy, Measure, Action List.
- March 25, 2024: Commission approves Phasing of CAAP Measure, Action List, which identifies top priorities for staff to address in the first three (3) years of CAAP implementation.
- April 2024 June 2024: County staff attends public outreach events throughout the County and hosts 3 in-person workshops in the unincorporated cities of Knights Landing and Esparto, offering one workshop to be lead fully in Spanish and two workshops to be multi-lingual in both English and Spanish.
- June 7, 2024: A press release announces that the DRAFT CAAP is released for Public Comment. County staff engage in a significant outreach push to solicit public comment and inform the community of available workshops. Outreach included posting flyers throughout the County, inclusion in local newsletters, flyer distribution with support from County CBOs, and posting on social media, the Climate Action and Sustainability websites, and in the Sustainability Division's monthly newsletter.
- **Ongoing Throughout the Development of the CAAP**: Staff have conducted targeted outreach in an effort to center equity, a Just Transition, and engage all community members in the CAAP development process, attending over 34 tabling events, receiving over 1,000 survey responses from the community, presenting at 20 public meetings, and hosting three series of CAAP Community Workshops.

At this time, County staff are requesting high-level feedback on the DRAFT CAAP. County staff recommend key areas for guiding the review and discussion of feedback on the DRAFT CAAP:

- Feedback on the Appendices: Are the appendices comprehensive and relevant? Do they provide sufficient detail to support the main content of the CAAP? Are there any additional elements that should be included?
- Feedback on the Chapters: Are the chapters organized logically and coherently? Do they effectively address the key objectives outlined for each section? Is there any information that seems redundant or could be streamlined?
- Feedback on Chapter 6: Strategies, Measures, and Actions: Are the strategies outlined in Chapter 6 aligned with the overall goals of the CAAP? Are there any critical strategies, measures, or actions that appear to be missing? Is the language used clear and accessible, or are there areas that require simplification or further explanation? Are there specific items that need clarification or additional detail?
