Stay Healthy This Fall: Join Yolo County's Free Flu Vaccine Clinics

(Woodland, CA) – As flu season approaches, the Yolo County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) is encouraging all residents to stay current with their vaccinations. To support this effort, HHSA will host nine free flu clinics throughout Yolo County this fall.

The clinics will provide residents with easy access to the influenza vaccine, which is recommended for everyone aged six months and older. Below is the schedule for the clinics:

Dr. Aimee Sisson, Yolo County's Public Health Officer, emphasized the value of these free clinics by stating, "Vaccines play a key role in reducing severe illness, hospitalization, and death. I strongly recommend that everyone in Yolo County who is 6 months old and older get a flu shot every year. Now is a great time to get a flu vaccine before flu season begins in November."

While these clinics focus on making flu vaccinations available to people without insurance and do not offer other vaccines, residents are also encouraged to consider RSV and COVID-19 vaccinations heading into winter. An updated '24-'25 COVID-19 vaccine is recommended for everyone 6 months and older. In addition, the CDC recommends a single dose of the RSV vaccine for infants younger than 8 months, high risk infants and toddlers up to 18 months, people who are 32-36 weeks pregnant, adults aged 75 and older, and for adults aged 60–74 with increased risk of severe RSV disease.

In addition to the county-run flu clinics, residents can obtain flu and other vaccines through their healthcare providers and local pharmacies.
