## **Last Free Tire Amnesty Event of the Year in Yolo County**

(Woodland, CA) – Yolo County is hosting this year’s last tire amnesty event for the collection of used passenger car, truck and farm tractor tires. During this one day event, sponsored by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) “Zero Waste – You Make it Happen” program, there will be no charge for the disposal of used tires.

**What:** Tire Amnesty Event (free disposal of used tires)

**Where:** Sat., May 16, 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon  
Yolo County Central Landfill, 44090 County Road 28H, Woodland  
Note: limit of 20 tires per vehicle

Those hauling more than nine waste tires must obtain a waste tire hauler permit, or request an exemption from the Yolo County Environmental Health Department, Local Enforcement Agency. Call (530) 666-8646 for more information on exemptions. Members of the Farm Bureau may call (530) 662-6316 for assistance with hauler permits.

- Tires that will be accepted include all passenger vehicle, truck and tractor tires that are air filled with no solid areas.
- Tires with rims will be accepted, but heavy equipment tires will not be accepted.
- Tire bins full of tires will not be accepted at these events. Those with tire bins full of tires may contact Shamrock Recycling, Inc. directly at (916) 343-6282 for proper management of tires.
